Child Injury & Death Scene Re-enactment and Scene Reconstruction; Sudden Unexplained Infant Death Investigations (SUIDI)

This training session will stress the techniques and benefits of scene reenactment and scene reconstruction in serious child abuse and death investigations as well as covering SUIDI training.

Each year, more than 4,500 infants die suddenly of no obvious cause in the United States. Only half of these sudden, unexplained infant deaths (SUID) are due to sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS). Some deaths previously classified as SIDS are now classified as due to accidental suffocation or undetermined by M.E.'s that are provided with SUIDI re-enactments. Scene re-enactment/scene reconstruction in abuse and death investigations is beneficial in determining accident from intentional injury. They assist CPT physicians, M.E.'s and other medical specialists in determining cause of injury and death in child abuse cases.

Attendees will learn the skills needed to provide an investigation that will lead to a more accurate determination of the cause of injury and person's) responsible.

How to Create an LCMS Account:

- To access the Learning Content Management System (LCMS), enter www.adph.org/extranet into your web browser's address bar.
- Click the "Log In" link in the upper right corner of the LCMS "Training Opportunities" page.
